The PLPLG would like to thank all their practice partners, academic staff, students and service users for working in partnership to develop the new PLPAD 2.0 documentation and SSSA resources.

#### Standards for student supervision and assessment

The Pan London Practice Learning Group have collaborated extensively with their stakeholders and there has been agreement from all partners to develop a pan London approach to the development of the new roles of Practice Supervisor and Practice Assessor. A consistent approach aims to support enhanced learning and assessment processes and will be introduced in September 2019 across London to support students learning and assessment in practice.

### **Resources to support implementation of SSSA**

The PLPLG, in consultation with their practice partners, have developed a range of resources to prepare Practice Supervisors and Practice Assessors for the new roles as detailed in the *Standards for student supervision and assessment*, (NMC 2018). The resources include sessions to prepare current mentors to transition to the new role of Practice Assessor and sessions to prepare new staff for the roles of Practice Supervisor and Practice Assessor. The development of resources to prepare staff for these new roles has been supported with funding from CapitalNurse. The PLPLG launched the resources at a Stakeholder event in May and facilitated two one day workshops in June to Develop Key Facilitators in how the resources could be used in organisations. The PLPLG are delighted to have received positive feedback on the resources.

Information is included in relation to the NMCs Future Nurse standards of proficiency for pre-registration nurses, standards for nursing associates and the SSSA (2018).

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Pan London Practice Learning Group Standards for Student Supervision and Assessment Resources

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The Development Route Map gives an overview of all the resources available. These have been developed to be used flexibly depending on the organisations needs and include face to face modules and e-learning modules.

Sample versions of Pan London Practice Assessment Documents are included and can be downloaded, copied and used in training sessions. The resources are designed to be used flexibly depending on the organisations needs and based on discussions with their local AEIs to agree the most appropriate approach.

Work is continuing across London on the development of the e-PAD. The PLPLG will keep their partners informed of progress.

### Key achievements

- ➤ PLPLG have led development of PLPAD 2.0 to meet NMC Future Nurse Proficiencies in collaboration with practice partners, academic staff, students and service users. Engaged with over 5,000 staff.
- > PLPAD 2.0 commended by NMC for leading sector and collaborative nature of development of PLPAD 2.0.
- ➤ Pan London approach to SSSA with development of website and resources to support practice partners preparing staff for new roles and using new documentation.
- > PLPAD 2.0 has been adopted by 74 universities in England with some minor variations.
- ➤ The PLPLG led the development of the England Nursing Associate PAD building on the work of PLPAD 2.0. Commended by NMC.
