On behalf of the Project Team and PLPLG members we would like to thank those who have engaged with the PLPAD so far. Since June 2017, the Project Manager has met with 1200 individuals in face to face meetings, including the PLPAD February Stakeholder Event and various meetings and conferences in Trusts and HEIs.

February Stakeholder Event 3 at Camden Centre, Kings Cross

We held our 3rd Stakeholder Event on Monday 26th February, 2018 and despite problems with weather and transport over 140 attended with representation from all ten London HEIs, our practice partners, CapitalNurse and representation from a number of HEIs from the Midlands HEI Group. We were particularly pleased to have 17 students from the HEIs involved. We were delighted that Angela Thompson, Director of Nursing NHSI London was our guest speaker. The title of her presentation was 'Why is this collaborative working so important for the Capital's nurses?' which set the scene perfectly for the day. The focus for the event was to work in groups and feedback on draft documentation including professional values, episodes of care, medicines management, skills and simulation. The groups provided us with constructive and detailed feedback to enable us to develop the next stage of the document.

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The Project Manager and PLPLG Members will continue to work with local staff, partners and students to develop the documents, taking on board all of the feedback to date. A number of groups reflecting all stakeholders are being developed to take this work forward. These include Adult, Child, Mental Health, Learning Disability, Community (Health and Social Care) and the Education Framework. Service Users are being engaged at a local level by HEIs.

The NMC standards are due to go to NMC Council for approval at the end of March 2018. Following the publication of the NMC Standards and Education Framework further events will be planned to specifically explore a Pan London approach to the new roles of Practice Supervisor, Practice Assessor and Academic Assessor. The Project Manager will also lead on developing an electronic document and work to ensure we have one provider for London.
