Update from NMC

The NMC published the new Quality assurance framework for nursing, midwifery and nursing associate education. Universities will use the guidance in the QA framework to prepare evidence for validation of new programmes. This can be accessed from the website.

The NMC are undertaking a series of roadshows around the 4 countries in September to consider how universities and their practice partners will prepare for the transition to the new NMC Future Nurse proficiencies (NMC 2018) and the new Standards for Student Supervision and Assessment (NMC 2018). Stakeholder engagement

The Project Manager and the PLPLG continue to engage with our stakeholders across London. Recent events attended included the PVI Mentor Conference at the University of Hertfordshire, the Mentor Conference at Imperial NHS Trust, Middlesex University Mentor Conference and Barts Health Key Mentor Forum. The Project Manager has directly engaged with 3,200 stakeholders since June 2017.

Standards for student supervision and assessment

Since the Stakeholder Event in July the PLPLG have continued to work on the Pan London approach to the implementation of the SSSA. We are pleased to inform our practice stakeholders that all universities plan to transition to the SSSA from September 2019. This unified approach and all HEIs transitioning at the same time, should make it easier for our practice partners to implement the new approach to supporting and assessing students in practice. The PLPLG will be hosting another workshop in October for the Lead Practice Educators across London who attended our May event to get further feedback and approval for London's approach to the SSSA. We will then host a wider event for our practice stakeholders.



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
